



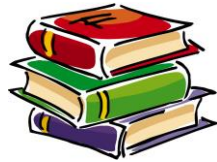
# Kidbrooke Park Primary School

## Year 3 Curriculum Overview

### Autumn 1 Term

#### Reading

Our author focus is Roald Dahl, who is regarded as one of the greatest child authors, who at one point in his life, lived in Bexley Village. Even though lots of children are becoming fluent readers, it is still really valuable for them to spend time reading with you and talking about what they have read.



#### Maths

For this half term, we will be looking at the place value of digits within numbers to 1,000, such as partitioning them into Thousands, Hundreds, Tens and Ones as well as comparing numbers using  $<$ ,  $>$  and  $=$ . After this, we will begin addition and subtraction, again up to 1,000 with a particular focus of adding without bridging 10, such as in  $34+21$ .

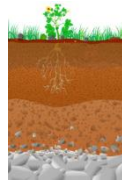
#### English

The whole school is looking at 'After the Fall' by Dan Santat, a sequel to the famous Humpty Dumpty nursery rhyme. The book explores Humpty Dumpty's fears and we will write a letter of advice to overcome them. Following this, we will focus on Catherine Johnson, where we will look at resilience.



#### Science

In Science, we will continue to develop our scientific enquiry skills through the topic 'Rocks and Soils'. We will plan, conduct and evaluate a number of different experiments. We will be using the results of our experiments to help us solve a 'real life' problem.



#### Geography

Our key question will be: What is the difference between a rural and urban area? We shall be focusing on identifying these different concepts within Britain and looking at human and physical features.



#### Times Tables

All children have a national times tables test in Year 4. In order to help prepare for them, we will be ensuring that pupils leave Year 3 with solid knowledge of x2, x5, x10, x4 and x8 tables. Other tables can still be learnt. Times Tables Rockstar logins will be provided to support learning.



#### Computing

This half term, children will learn to compose and mix music through the Garageband app on iPads to create their own complex compositions.



#### Art

For Art this half term, the children will be revisiting the work of Pablo Picasso, consolidating their understanding of abstract art.



#### RE

For the first half term, we shall be looking at how different religions look at the creation of the world. This unit will also look at non-religious views such as the Big Bang Theory.

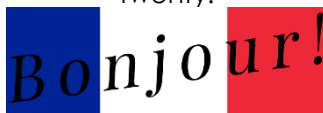


#### PSHE
